THE ST. JAMES STORY WARMS HEARTS & SOULS

For over thirty years, volunteers from St. James Episcopal Church in Painesville – along with its many partner churches – have been feeding the poor out of a vintage 1940s kitchen.

Parishioners began the St. James Lunch Program in 1983 to feed the hungry on Saturdays and Sundays. As the need and support from neighboring churches grew, we began providing lunch on legal holidays and simple evening meals on Monday and Tuesday as well.

Devoted volunteers from thirteen churches and three secular groups feed the homeless, the mentally ill and

displaced, the working poor, the aged on fixed incomes, and transient families seeking work and stability in our community. And we've felt honored to do so.

But now the time has come to update our building to current health and building department standards, so that we can continue this valuable work...and expand the scope of what we do from a simple soup kitchen to a full-service community center for one and all.

This is why the Soup to Service Campaign was launched.

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FROM DINNER TO DISH WASHING... OUR CURRENT DILEMMA BEGAN IN THE KITCHEN

The success of our thirty-year-old feeding program inspired us to renovate the St. James kitchen. If we could do so much with so little, we reasoned, imagine how many more people we could help with an updated kitchen? We envisioned a kitchen area where food could be safely stored, efficiently prepared, and lovingly served in a pleasant, well-appointed dining/meeting area.

But as our kitchen renovation plans developed, we began to realize that an outdated kitchen wasn't the only issue requiring attention:

- ✓ The subfloor in our 150 year old building is not adequate, simply built on top of sleepers (floor joists,) creating critter problems and mustiness.

- ✓ The rest rooms are minimal: two single-use unisex washrooms and one fifty-year old, two-stall men's room...limiting our ability to fully utilize the building for outreach in collaboration with social service and educational organizations, and hosting community members' events in a flexible space.

If St. James is able to accomplish these basic renovations to our kitchen, floor, and rest rooms, we can expand from a simple soup kitchen to a flexible community facility that serves the entire Painesville community. Support for the Soup to Service Campaign will enable us to do it.

FROM SOUP TO SERVICE... LOOK WHAT ST. JAMES HAS ALREADY ACCOMPLISHED!

St. James is a 190-year-old congregation, deeply rooted in serving our community's less fortunate. Fiscally responsible and stable, we have our own 501(C) 3 autonomous foundation for endowment.

Having achieved so much already, St. James is well on its way to becoming a 'go to,' Soup to Service, fully appointed-community sharing center:

- ✓ St. James is well respected in the community with a vibrant feeding ministry that serves 400 meals a week...that's 20,000 meals a year!
- ✓ The program is open to the entire community; whether hungry or lonely, everyone is welcome to share a meal.
- ✓ This year the St. James Lunch Program celebrates its 30th anniversary.
- ✓ St. James is a hub for community service, with thirteen partner churches and numerous social service organizations.

- ✓ Recognized for treating people with dignity, St. James offers spiritual sustenance to the homeless, the poor and the mentally ill as with our parishioners.
- ✓ Through St. James, the community at large is provided with funeral services, baptisms, and marriages.
- ✓ As a partner in the Lake County Continuum of Care, St. James assists numerous Lake County social service agencies reach people needing help.
- ✓ St. James receives food and/or service donations from the Lake County Juvenile Court, the Painesville Municipal court, the Painesville Post Office, and many service and religious organizations, as well as businesses throughout the Lake County area.
- ✓ The groups already served by St. James include four 12-step support groups, Tai Chi for Health, and pre-school Christmas and graduation programs.

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LOOK WHAT ST. JAMES HAS ALREADY ACCOMPLISHED!

- ✓ St. James makes worship space available regardless of denomination, serving as the first home of St. Nicholas Orthodox Church and two congregations of the Church of God in Christ.
- ✓ St. James fosters service in younger generations through supervised projects with Cub Scouts and

Girl Scouts, our partner church youth groups and confirmation classes.

But we don't think this is enough....St. James parishioners want to update our facility to become a greater resource for all our community.
